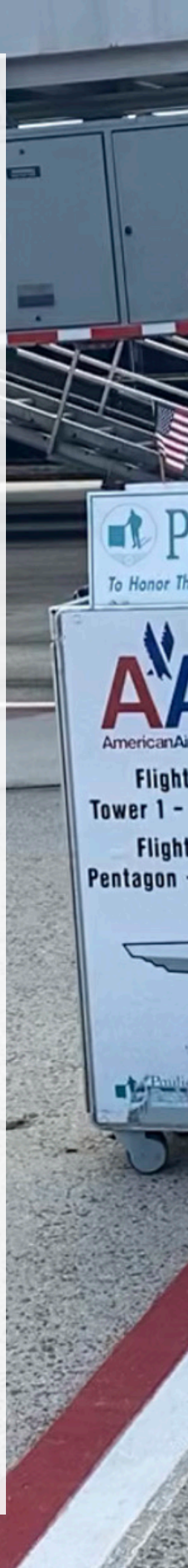

Who's Paulie?

In 2021 the world watched as Boston native Paul Veneto, a retired United Airlines flight attendant, pushed an airline beverage cart 220 miles from Boston-Logan International Airport to Ground Zero. His mission, an intensely personal one: to honor his flight crew colleagues - or, as Paulie calls them, the 'first, first responders' of 9/11. By the time Paulie arrived on September 11, the 20th anniversary of 9/11, a movement had been born.

The following year Paulie turned his attention to Washington, where he'd push his cart from Washington Dulles International Airport to the Pentagon along a route representing the flight path of American Airlines Flight 77. Later that year travel and aviation-themed publication The Points Guy named Paulie their 'Hero in Travel.'

This year Paulie's Push is the longest yet: 300 miles over 30 days, from Newark Liberty International Airport to the Flight 93 National Memorial in Stoystown, PA. Paulie's Push 3 begins on August 14! Visit PauliesPush.com for more information and to follow his journey.

Saturday, August 12 - Quincy, MA

On Saturday, August 12, Paulie and two grade-school friends (and the first members of Team Paulie), Stevie and Dennis, will attend their high school reunion (Milton High Class of 1978) at the Adams Inn, Quincy. At 10 PM the Quincy Police Department and Quincy Fire Department will escort the Paulie's Push RV from The Adams Inn up Hancock Street, finishing at the Star Market, 130 Granite St, Quincy, MA 02169, where well-wishers are invited to come out and see them off as they depart for Newark.

Sunday, August 13 - West Orange, NJ

Paulie and his crew will join flight attendant Deborah Calimano at the Essex County (NJ) Eagle Rock 9/11 Memorial at 10 a.m. on Sunday, August 13, with plans to spend part of the day at the memorial for flight attendants placed there. Address: Eagle Rock Ave & Prospect Ave, West Orange, NJ 07052.

Monday, August 14 - Newark-Liberty International Airport, Newark, NJ

On Monday, August 14 the administration team at the Port Authority of New York & New Jersey will hold a sendoff ceremony outside of Building One, the administration building at Newark-Liberty International Airport. From there the Push begins: 300 miles over the next 30 days, all the way to Stoystown and Shanksville, PA.

Paulie's planned route will take him through many, many communities in New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Among them are larger cities like Allentown and Harrisburg, PA.

Sunday, September 10 - Shanksville, PA

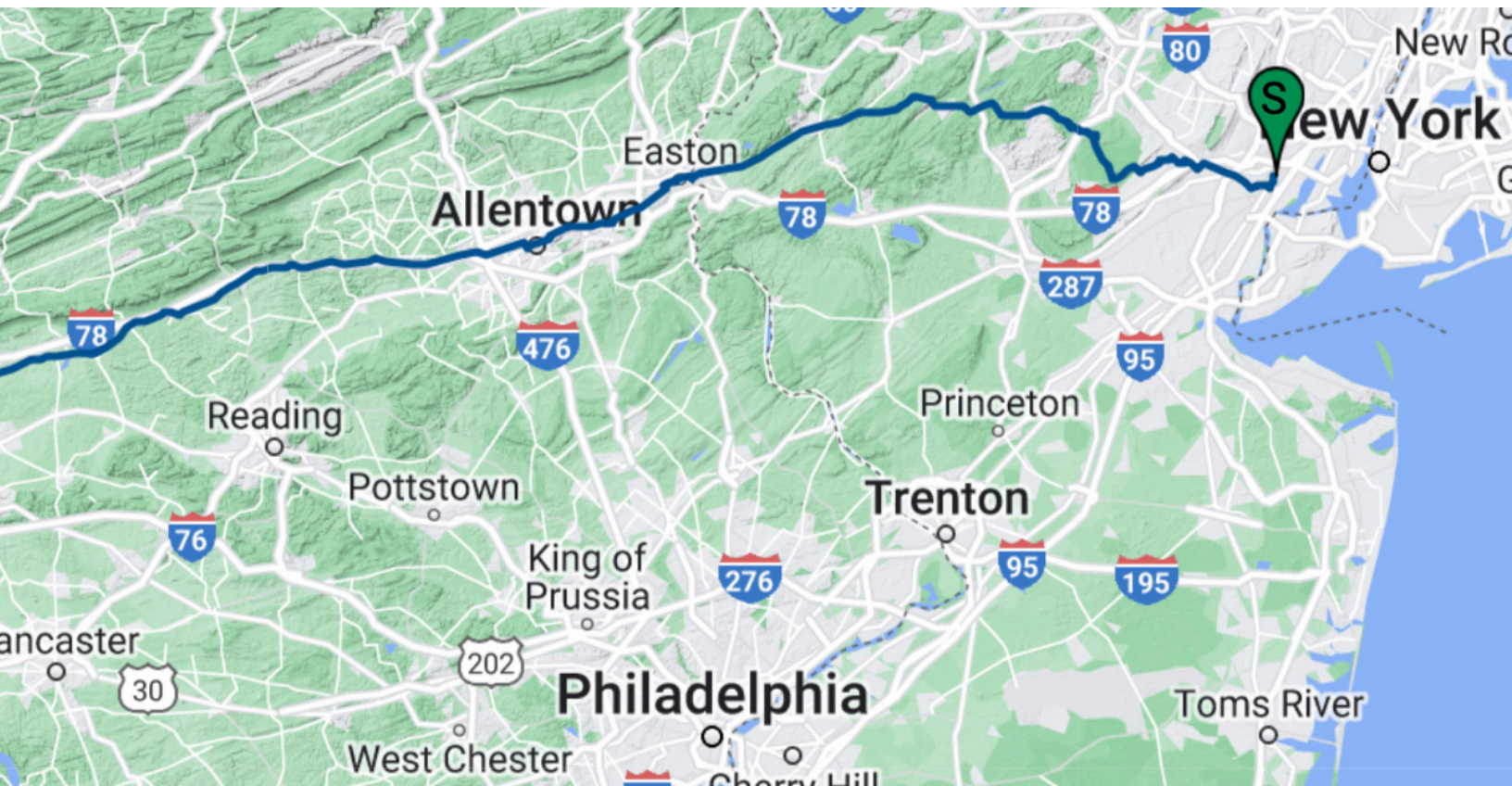
Paulie and his crew plan to attend services at the Flight 93 Memorial Chapel in Shanksville on Sunday, September 10 at 10:04 a.m. - services begin at the time that Flight 93 crashed into a nearby field. A memorial to those who perished on Flight 93 - including a special memorial for the flight crew - can be found on the grounds.

Monday, September 11 - Flight 93 National Memorial, Stoystown, PA

Paulie's journey ends on Monday, September 11 as he pushes his cart into the Flight 93 National Memorial in Stoystown, PA. Tentative plans are for Paulie to begin pushing those final miles to arrive at the site of the memorial at 12 noon.
